Meet the Teacher Sessions 2019

This year, we will have two 'Meet the Teacher' sessions on the same day - **14th February**. The times for these sessions are 11am and 6pm. This is to ensure we are available at a time that suits you.

Day session: At **11am** we would like to whānau to meet us in the hall for a short whakatau / welcome. From there, your tamariki will take you to their class to meet their teacher(s) and show you around their learning environment. We will be holding a scavenger hunt with different challenges and activities that you can do with your tamaiti/tamariki for fun as you explore our kura! Whānau who complete the hunt will go into the draw for a meat pack! At 12.45pm (lunchtime) we will be holding a sausage sizzle for \$1 each. You are welcome to stay and enjoy lunch with us! If you decide to take your child home early after this event please ensure you sign out at the office.

Evening session: At **6pm** we would like whānau to meet us in the hall for a short whakatau / welcome. From there, please visit our classes and take part in our scavenger hunt. We will have sausage sizzles available from 6 - 7pm at \$1 each.

Noho Marae 2019

Our students will be participating in a Noho Marae this year as we do each year. We value this experience for our tamariki as we are able to experience learning outside the classroom and use this time to build relationships with our peers and teachers. Our learning this year is very much centred around our local environment and our pepeha so this visit will be an opportunity to capitalise on our learning. We do require whānau help during this Marae stay so if you think you may be interested in coming along and spending time with us please have a chat with your child's class teacher. This year we will be going in team groups: Junior, Middle, Senior, Iriirikapua (Rumaki). Dates below:

Our teams will send out more detailed information specific to your child's Noho Marae. If you have any questions or concerns come in and see our friendly staff! Please note - there is no charge for Noho Marae however, we do ask for a packet of biscuits or tinned fruit/spaghetti to help with supplies.

Nurse in School - Coming Soon!

Health and wellbeing is very important. We understand that our tamariki need to be fit and healthy in order to make the most of each school day. Very soon, we will have a registered nurse based in our school one morning per week. This will mean you can come in with no appointment and receive health advice and treatments for your whānau at NO COST. If at anytime you would like to make contact with our Piripoho Nurse or Public Health Nurse please email: callie.raureti@owhata.school.nz or pop in and see one of our staff members.

The ear, nose and throat Nurse comes to visit often, if you would like your child to have a hearing check, please let us know and we can send home a permission slip. This will secure your child a booking in the next visit.

Dental care is provided for all of our tamariki.

We can offer assistance with breakfast and lunches - we also do daily fruit and milk.

School Attendance

We are monitoring attendance more closely this year. It is a goal of ours to have 100% attendance from all tamariki. Of course, sickness and whānau matters are an exception. Absence without reason or regular absences and lateness can have an impact on learning progress. If you are having difficulty getting to school, please let us know. Attendance = Achievement!

Owhata Transition to School 2019

We have made some changes effective Wednesday 30th Jan 2019.

Our transition class will now run from our New Entrant class – Hub 2 with:

- Callie Raureti (Junior School Leader /Across-Cluster ECE – Primary/SENCo)
- Katie Murray (NE Class teacher)
- Miriama Walker (Programme coordinator / Teacher Aide)
- Sheryll Strickett (Teacher Aide)

We expect that our tamariki transitioning to Owhata School will spend 8 – 10 weeks (full term prior) coming to visit once per week (Wednesday). We encourage whānau to attend 1 – 2 sessions and extend that invite to our ECE Kaiako and whanau.

We continue to offer van pick-ups, however welcome whanau to bring their own tamaiti. Our van aims to collect our tamariki between 11.45 – 12.30pm.

Whānau collect their tamaiti from Hub 2 at the end of the session – 2.55pm.

New Entrant teachers will make 2 visits to each centre to see tamariki in their own environment.

We can arrange visits to our rumaki class – Māori immersion, if that is your child's pathway.
